For example, if I was made fun of for liking a specific TV show, then I would be able to remember a moment when I made fun of someone else's interests and assume that that person must have felt the same way I felt when I was poked fun at. That was my first ever thought process related to Karma.

As I've matured and experienced how the world works, my belief in Karma evolved beyond the Golden Rule. I believe Karma not only enforces the Golden Rule, but also creates balance in every aspect of people's lives. When I see how kids who grow up in a wealthy family become undisciplined to hard work, or how happy-go-lucky individuals are often ignorant of the world around them, it reminds me of Karma.

My learning about karma was especially deepened while taking an AP Psychology class. One psychology theory that really stood out to me was the Opponent-Process Theory of Emotion, which states that opposite emotions follow up on one another, like happiness and sadness, such that a person will experience great happiness after experiencing great sadness. When learning about this in class, I correlated it with Karma balancing out positive and negative emotions. This theory also applied to me after quarantine. During the lock-down, it was hard for me to feel happy about anything. On the contrary, when quarantine ended, I found it difficult to feel sad about anything. For me, this event was a great display of Karma balancing my positive and negative experiences.

Even for people who never experienced periods of depression, but rather live life in a depressing envi-

ronment, Karma still balances life out for them. I was able to see this in person at a remote orphanage in Nepal. Since my ethnic origin lies in Nepal, I chose to sponsor a field trip for the orphanage center, taking them around the city of Dhulikhel, Nepal. Experiencing the city is something that I've done many times and have gotten used to, however, the kids from the orphanage were able to find joy in the stalest moments of the trip; moments that I couldn't find as much joy in since they were so normal to me. Even though these kids grow up in such a sad environment compared to ours, Karma balances it out by letting them find happiness in anything.

# News Flash: President's Volunteer Service Award for Nepali American Center (NAC) Volunteers

Nepali American Center (NAC) is now approved as an official Certifying Organization for the President's Volunteer Service Award (PVSA)!

Volunteers must complete qualifying volunteer hours within a 12 month calendar, in order to become eligible for the award. There are many volunteer opportunities available within NAC for both adults and children.

Volunteer Eligibility: United States citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States & must be at least five years old. Applicable 12 month calendar for NAC: September – August . NAC is planning to accept applications for award from volunteers twice a year.
